COVID-19: The coronavirus has certainly impacted the way we do business. Please know that as we met this summer to make plans for this year's chapter activities, the health of our members was a main consideration. I continue to be confident that together, in the spirit of collaboration and cooperation, we will rise to meet any challenge ahead.

The results of my June/July phone survey confirmed that the vast majority of our members prefer to postpone in-person meetings until a vaccine for COVID has been found or the spread of the virus has gone down. Your responses also confirmed that more members are familiar with Zoom than Google Meet. In light of these results, we will hold meetings via Zoom from September to January. On January 4th we will reevaluate the COVID situation.

Technology: Technology Chair, Geri Nynas, researched Zoom capabilities, and recommended that we purchase Zoom Pro. It has many useful features including extended time for meetings rather than the 40 minutes offered through Zoom Basic. We purchased a one-year subscription for \$160.96 which will be paid for out of our Myrtie-Hunt Programming Funds. This fee is far less costly than the monthly facility fees we currently pay at venues around town.

Please feel free to contact Geri or any member of the Tech Committee for technology support or for answers to questions you may have regarding Zoom meetings. This new use of technology is a concern for many, so let's work together to ensure a smooth transition into this new normal.

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Attention! Critical Changes: Due to the critical change in our meeting format, we will be mailing new booklets to all members prior to our September meeting. Please note that all meeting information in the new booklet has been organized into two sections:

"Plan A" Zoom Meetings - in blue "Plan B" In-Person Meetings - in red

We did this to be ready for any scenario. We are prepared to hold Zoom meetings from now until October of 2021 if needed, but we are also ready to jump back into "business as usual" if the COVID situation improves. To avoid confusion, it's important that everyone familiarizes themselves with these changes.

Because we will definitely hold "Plan A" Zoom meetings from September through December, the previously assigned Program and Hostess Committees for those months will not be needed. Callers: Please note that your duties will look slightly different from Plan A to Plan B.

Everyone will be kept informed throughout the year regarding our meeting format especially when, and if, we transition from Plan A to Plan B.
